

### Workshop






### **Title: Motivating Ourselves to Motivate our Students**




**Title: Disaster Preparedness**





# **Dormitory Rules**

1. A door links the Education Center to the dormitory. This door is locked at 5:00 PM, so if you leave anything in the Education Center, please be sure to retrieve it before this time. After 5:00 PM, you **cannot** go to the computer building. The computer building is located near the lounge and has a motion sensor alarm.

### 2. Meals

- a. Dinner
  - i. Please buy dinner tickets **before 3:00pm** on the same day.
  - ii. Dinner will be served from 5 PM to 7:30 PM (Last Orders at 7:15).
- b. Breakfast
  - i. Please buy breakfast tickets **before 6:00pm** on the day before.
  - ii. Breakfast will be served from 7:30am 8:30am
- 3. Sheets, pillow cases, and blanket covers should be collected from **the linen closets**. Please take only what you need as the dormitory is used by many people and supplies are limited. Towels are **NOT** provided.
- 4. If you leave the dormitory in the evening, you must sign the **OUT** box on the room list and give your key to the dormitory superintendent. (**DON'T** leave the key on the counter of the dorm entrance.) When returning, pick up your key from the superintendent and sign the **IN** box.
- 5. The curfew for the dormitory is 10:00 PM. Therefore, you must return to the dormitory by 10:00 PM—NO EXCEPTIONS. Those found in violation of curfew may face disciplinary action. If some emergency prevents you from meeting the curfew, please call the front desk (263-1094). Inform them of your approximate time of arrival, so they will not lock you out of the dorm. There are very few circumstances when this is acceptable.
- 6. The baths are on the first floor; they are open from 5:30 PM to 10:30 PM. The bath is NOT open in the morning.
- 7. You may talk or watch TV in the lounges or the conversation room until 10:30 PM. These rooms will be closed at 10:30 PM, and **lights out** is at 11:00 PM. Please remember that there are other teachers (and fire fighters) staying at the dormitory. Be courteous and quiet at all times, especially during the evening hours.



- 8. There is a designated smoking area on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor (beside the cafeteria) —keep the remaining areas smoke-free.
- 9. There is no food, drinks, or smoking allowed in the dorm rooms. Do not bring cups into your room.
- 10. Please wear shoes or slippers in the hallways. Please keep your valuables with you at all times. Lock the door for security reasons when you leave your room.
- 11. In the morning, please
  - (1) fold up your futon and blanket, (follow the directions in your rooms)
  - (2) return your linen to the linen closet by 8:50,
  - (3) clean the floor with the cleaning wiper, and empty the garbage bins, (put into the bins in the lounge according to the material specified.)
- (4) don't remove the plastic bag inside the bin, nor the cloth on the cleaning wipers,
  - (4) shut the curtains,
  - (5) turn off the heater.


